It is not intended to fortify your wrist against the rigours of masturbation! It is YOUR PASSPORT TO ALL EVENTS AT AIH'93 and shows the emergency phone number to call if you're in (REAL) trouble. 2. IF YOU GET HURT, try not to move. Sit down beside the trail well out of the way of oncoming hashers. If you get hurt on what you know to be a false section of the trail, try (if you safely can) to move back to a spot close to the last check. Wait for help.
3. IF YOU SEE AN INJURED HASHER, shout a warning to those running behind you so they know to take care in passing. Offer assistance if requested. Take the injured hasher's name and report it to someone with a communications radio.

The Canadian Ski Patrol are skilled in first aid and will be helping the hares and co-hares to sweep the trail.

TRAIL LENGTHS

We've set trails of varying lengths to please hashers of all persuasions, from beerhounds to endorphan addicts. To exercise your free right of choice, simply seek out a Bus Mother carrying a sign showing the length of run you want and board his/her bus. But remember that its FIRST CUM, FIRST SERVED - If the buses bound for your first choice are full, you'd better pray your second choice is still available.

TRAIL MARKINGS - READ CAREFULLY

The Calgary H3 have experimented with, and perfected, over 4,835,267.5 different forms of hashing (and sexual positions). However, to minimize chaos at AIH'93, we have chosen to use the CH3's simple "Abu Dhabi" system of hashing that is designed for the sensitive, new-age, beer-logged half-mind of the 90's.

It uses only 3 basic signals:

ON - pretty universal in most hashing circles. If this is unfamiliar to you, refer to the Book of Genesis and continue reading from there. If you can't read, just take it. Do what those around you are doing and say what they say.

CHECK - from here the trail may go in any direction (but only one way is correct)

CHECKBACK - too bad - you chose a false trail at the last CHECK. Now, turn around, go back to the last CHECK and try another trail from there (NYAH NYAH).

NOW FROM HERE, THINGS GET A BIT TRICKIER !!

In order to effectively adapt to the varying terrain over which you'll be running during AIH'93, we'll be using the following 3 systems of trail markings:

NOTE: the MEDIUM run on Sat/Sun will be marked in white tape with BLUE polka dots
the other Sat/Sun runs will be marked in white tape with RED polka dots

You'll occasionally also find the following marks at points along the trail:

RG - for "Regroup" - many of you call this a BEER CHECK. Enough said. Enjoy.

ON IN - YAHOO! you're at, or within sight of, the end of the trail (and you're not bear bait!)

If you review this section carefully, we're confident that your brain will overcome the apparent confusion and guide you successfully to the trail's end. If not, at least Yogi and Boo-Boo will be well fed for the winter.

CLOTHING

You'll want to consider full-length running tights for the runs outside the city - you'll probably encounter thick brush, some patches of thistle and other thorned plants. Although daytime temperatures are normally warm in Calgary in early September, we have a saying here: "If you don't like the weather, wait 10 minutes!" It also cools off a lot in the evening due to the altitude...even more so in the mountains. It has rained tons this year so you can expect mucho shiggy and water on the runs. The bottom line: **PACK YOUR RUN BAG WITH A FULL CHANGE OF WARM CLOTHING AND BE SURE TO PUT IT ON THE SHAG WAGON BEFORE LEAVING FOR THE RUN. (DON'T FORGET TO PACK YOUR AIR BEER STEIN TOO!)**

MOSQUITOS AND OTHER BLESSINGS

The GREAT WHITE NORTH is second to none this year in boasting a bumper crop of nasty vermin that have been known to suck a sumo wrestler dry in 38.4 seconds. They will be especially sociable on the trails outside the city - so bring some "OFF" or "MUSKOL" along to ensure your survival.

BEER - THE AGONY AND THE ECSTASY

Ooooooooooh, your lips are gonna quiver when you wrap them around the rim of a glass full of the best suds you've ever inhaled....BIG ROCK! Unpasteurized! Pure Malt! No Preservatives! Whether its "Traditional", "Pale Ale", "Royal Coachman" or "Warthog", we know you'll want more & more & more. But while its only natural to want to punch down on the accelerator, remember that this stuff may be a wee bit stronger than you're used to. Enjoy.....but pace yourself.

You should also be aware of our wanking liquor laws since they too may be a wee bit stronger than you're used to. Really nothing to worry about. Simply remember to keep your drinking to within the area (room, roped off area, etc.) where its being served, and you're unlikely to get shot. If you want to buy anything, all booze and most wine & beer

is sold out of Alberta government liquor stores. The closest ones to the Westin are:

You'll notice these guys keep bankers hours. Even better, they're closed Sunday and Labour Day Monday. But, we have a new invention: THE COLD BEER VENDOR!

Page 8 has a map of the downtown area showing the location of some things you'll need to enhance your fun and mitigate your pain. Most of the streets in and around downtown are numbered so its easy to find your way around. Streets run north-south and Avenues run east-west. Calgary is divided into quadrants - downtown is mostly located in the S.W. quadrant, bounded on the east by Centre St. and the north by the Bow River. The street or avenue number increases as you get farther from the city centre. Even a half-mind can find its way around in Calgary (without Hash markings).

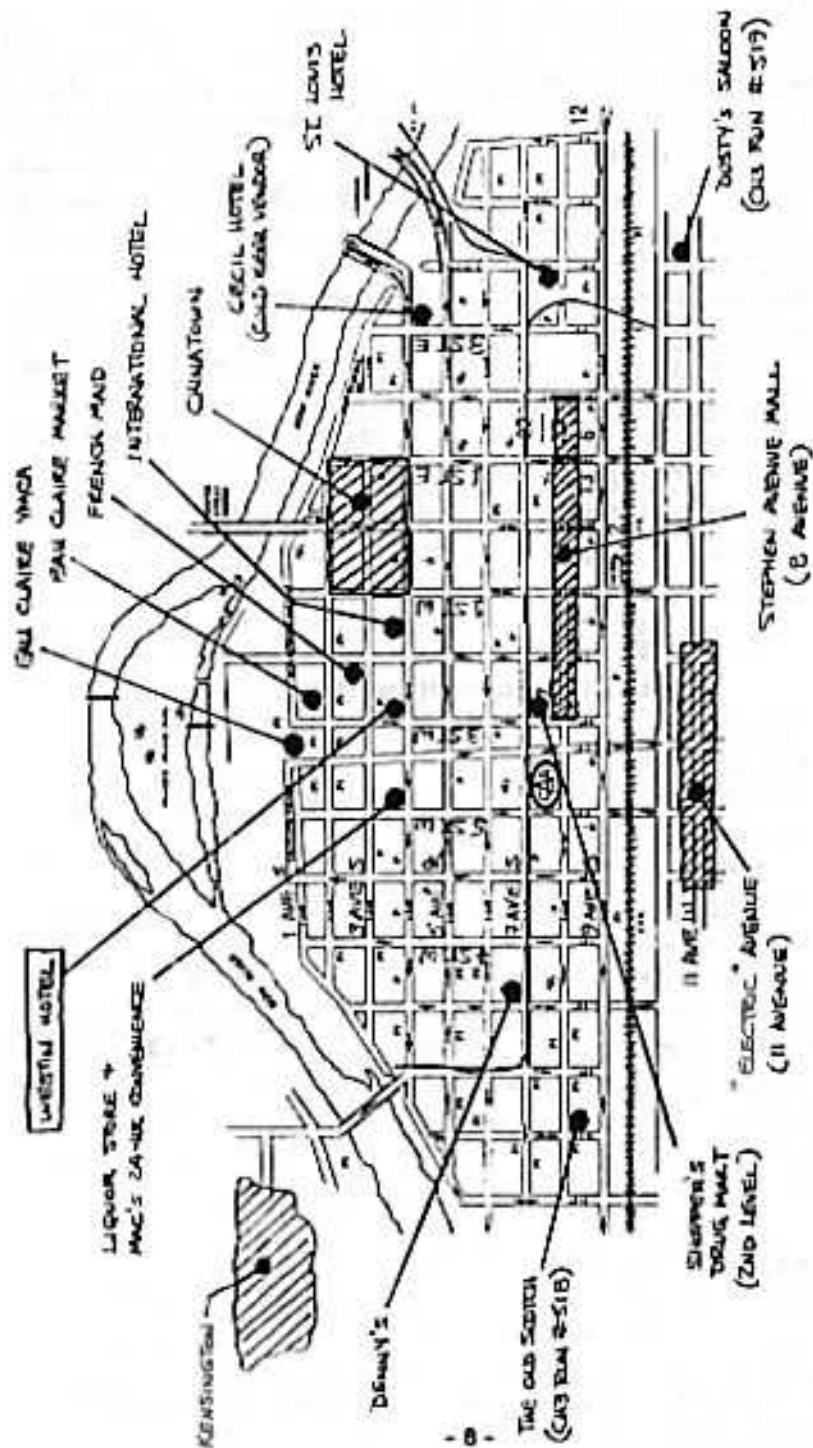

YOUR HOSTS - THE CALGARY HASH HOUSE HARRIERS

Hashing history in Calgary began on May 30, 1983 with our Father, the venerable Mike OOMBALA Carr, leading a wild pack of 15 oversexed and beerthirsty accountants (a rarity indeed) down the inaugural trail which wound its way through Inglewood, a neighbourhood which has recently laid claim to some of Calgary's seedier brothels - a development for which the VIRGIN 15 will no doubt take credit. OOMBALA's original vision to emulate his mother Hash in Jakarta very soon fell prey to Canadian weather and liquor laws. Undaunted, the Hash degenerated nonetheless.

Twelve moons and 23 runs after the CH3 was founded, the Harriers began sharing the trail with Harriettes. The wisdom in deciding to go co-ed manifested itself almost immediately in a move to once-a-week hashing 3 runs later. But perhaps the greatest milestone in the Hash's annals (or is it anal?) was when Big Rock Brewery officially joined as sponsor after ALPHABET's first Annual Bear & Chile Fartorama (Run #138) in late 1980. From there on, the CH3 evolved, revolved, reciprocated and regurgitated its way through endless summer shiggy and sub -30 degree Celsius temperatures. The Hashit and the Half-Yard served to mark the trail to the 10th Anniversary and 500th Run, which fortunately coincided (by design) on May 29, 1993 - a Mis-Management feat that will in all likelihood be attributed to the Hash's "bean-counting" roots.

Today, over 150 Hounds can call themselves active Calgary Hashers. Attendance at the weekly Monday evening runs averages around 60 during the summer and 30 party souls during the snowy season. The CH3 is the proud home to such auspicious annual extravaganzas as the Stampede Hash Weekend, LAKEY's "St. Valentine's Day Eight-Lady Lay", ON-IN's "Robbie Burns Hash", GOLDBLOCKS' "Wet-Up-to-Yer-Eyeballs, Shiggy 'R Us" Run and the never-to-be-outdone LUMBERJACK's "Light Stick Fuck Up In Fish Creek Park" Run. A "Full Moon Hash" was halched on July 31, 1993.
