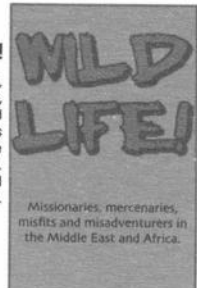

## It All Began Right Here!



**It all began here . . .** sometime in 1983, fairly new to hashing, Patchwork Quilt kept rantin' an' ravin' about a giant gathering of hashers from all over the Americas. He literally drove SJH3 crazy with his ideas, but slowly and convincingly, he gathered support.

Informal meetings and talks were held and the idea eventually gained some steam. The concept of an International hashing event to be held in Costa Rica sounded better and better with each meeting. Then finally, a date was decided upon, February 16-19, 1984. Sounds so very, very long ago! One thing Patchwork Quilt never brought to our attention, was the amount of organization needed and the mass amount of work that accompanied it.

With nearly 250 trails behind us, SJH3 had become a favorite customer of Costa Rica's one and only national brewery. Debauchery was the name of the game back then and SJH3 was certainly making a name for itself. So when we introduced the idea to the brewery, they gladly offered their sacred grounds as a venue for the first InterAm's opening run (pictured above).

Obviously in the 80's, communication amongst hashers was not as it is today with the Internet and websites. Getting the word out was a major undertaking. A mass "snail" mailing went out to each and every hasher's address SJH3 could find. When registrations came trickling in, it was too late to back out . . .and InterAm was no longer just His dream.

Unlike today, in 1984 SJH3 was a large hash group, and we decided to place every visiting hasher in our homes. (six Atlanta hashers alone stayed in Fancy Pant's small 1 bedroom). This avoided a major problem of finding a hotel that would accept and could survive the InterAm.

When it was all over, Atlanta swore that the next InterAm would be in their homes the following year, and so it was. However the powers to be in their 1985 InterAm decided that day in history on, InterAm should be held once every other year, on the odd. Philly grabbed the ball, and the rest is hashatory!

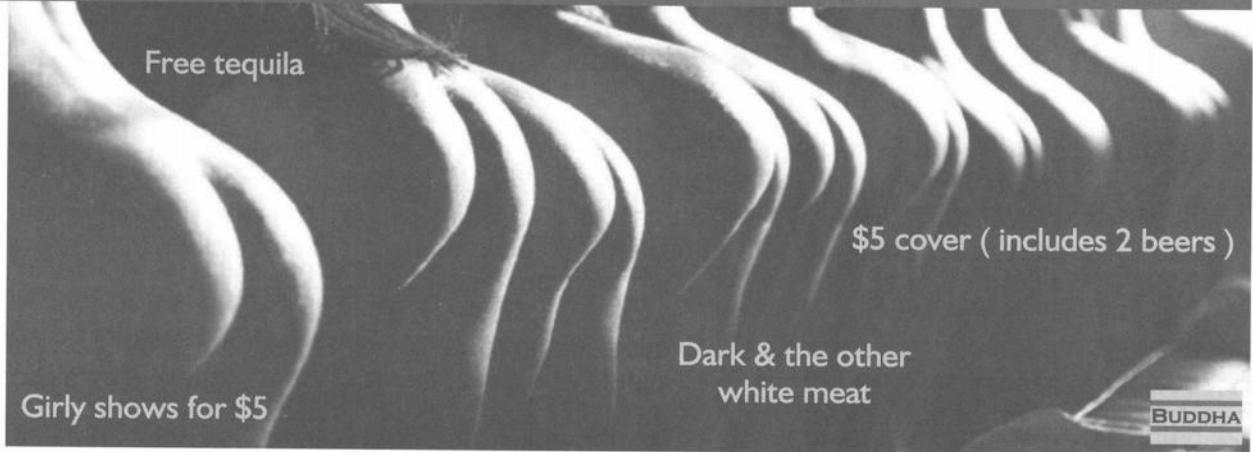
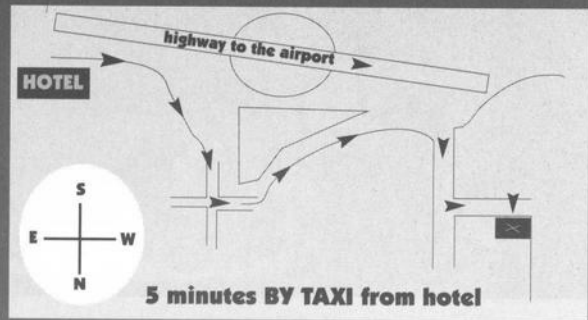
And so was the making of the InterAm, the little bit that can still be remembered that is.



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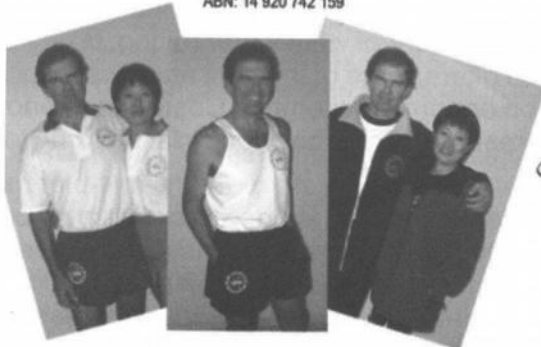

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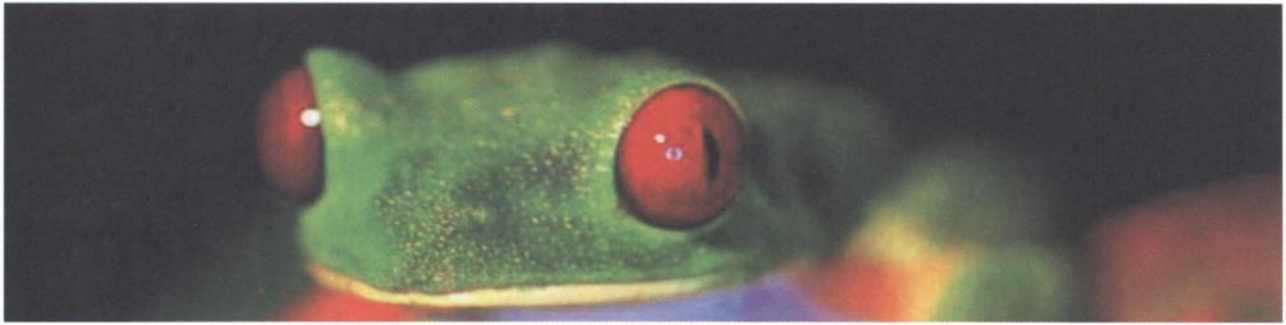


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## InterAm Comes back to Costa Rica

**Costa Rica** . . . offers a wonderful blend of recreation, nature and cultural activities with 32 national parks, reserves and wildlife refuges all within this small tropical Hasher paradise the size of West Virginia. Known internationally for its tropical rain forests, there are also massive mangrove, rare tropical dry forests to **set trails**, also active and inactive volcanoes, mountainous cloud forests, and spectacular Pacific and Caribbean coasts for overnight hash adventures.

**Costa Rica** . . . peaceful, friendly and safe, exotic and unforgettable with a national territory total of 19,700 square hashing miles. For those Half-minds who never heard of West Virginia, Costa Rica is slightly larger than Switzerland. Despite its diminutive size packed within its borders, are dozens of hash-like adventures, vast expanses of jungle and **shiggy**, several mountain ranges, countless rivers, lakes and waterfalls, 2 peninsulas, bays and 755 miles of coastline for future runs stretched along two separated oceans. Costa Rica, a hashers' paradise, blessed by two of our seven seas.



**Celebrated**. . . for accumulating nearly 1200 national "**Hash Run**" treasures, SJH3 is an intricate part of Costa Rica, though Hashing may not be the main attraction for all those who visit Costa Rica. Other natural attractions are the 850 recorded bird species and the endless varieties of plants and flowers found in the rainforests. Some cum for the adventure of whitewater rafting, biking and hiking mountains and active volcanoes. Costa Rica also offers some of the best and most exciting deep-sea fishing in the Hasher's world. Pure relaxation or pure excitement, Costa Rica, renown hashtorically for beautiful beaches, protected by rainforests and only now, world-class golfing too.

**Twenty-four years** . . . of hashing in this tropical paradise, Costa Rica is an extraordinary place to experience the tropics naturally and with minimal impact. Its reputation for enlightened environmental protection and conservation has become the pride of this small democratic and popular nation. Fortunately, several successive governments continue the efforts for preserving the country's proud image of being an important ecological haven for **hashers, and non-hashers** all alike.





## “Checking” Costa Rica



**Though Hashing . . .** dates back only to 1979, the human habitation of Costa Rica dates from at least 5000 BC, but in comparison with the great civilizations of pre-Columbian America, the indigenous people of Costa Rica were neither numerous nor highly developed (**early hashers?**). Little is known about pre-Columbian Costa Rica as few archaeological monuments have been discovered. The few remaining examples of the indigenous culture include a fabulous collection of jade and the archaeological site at Guayabo, as well as the tree of many checks **high above & lost** in the hills of Escazu .

**Costa Rica . . .** (the rich coast) was named by Christopher Columbus himself, who strayed here for 17 days in 1502. It wasn't until the 1560's that the first colony, Cartago, was settled in the central highlands. Contrary to Costa Rican fables, Cartago was destroyed by past earthquakes and not during **InterAm's** Inauguration in the late 1980's.



**Picturesque settings . . .** and superb weather, Costa Rica is a truly wonderful place to visit. This tropical Hashers' paradise offers an endless array of beautiful sights and natural attractions. to enjoy. Costa Rican people are well-known for their acceptance of hashing and other wild cultures. A very high national literacy rate attributes to the fact that **SJH3** is a very small hash group. Within this friendly nation, a majority of Costa Ricans have some knowledge of foreign languages, fresh hash trail markings, as well as “on & off trail” Hash shenanigans.

**Costa Rica . . .** has a winterless climate with only two seasons; wet or dry. The dry season is from mid-November to May. During the wet season, the shiggy grows rampant and the dry season comes and makes it all brittle and all scratchy-like. Our pleasant temperature varies little between the two seasons, as the main influence on temperature is the altitude. At 3772 ft. (1150 m), San Jose's climate is often referred to as 'eternal spring'. With the aid of **good binoculars**, Harriettes can often be spotted bathing 'friskily' in virgin Costa Rican streams and ponds.



## InterAmerica's 2003 Trails



Following **InterAm traditon**, there will be 4 official InterAm runs, plus a Pre-Lewd and a Post-Interam runs. The 4 official InterAm runs are all being sponsored and held by SJH3 members, while the "Pre" & "Post" hashes are being sponsored by other Hash groups. Your InterAm 2003 Registration fee includes the 4 official runs only, but that doesn't mean you can't enjoy the Pre & Post runs as well.

### Thursday, May 22 - The Okinawa Jungle Pre-lewd Run

The 5th Okinawa Prelewd is set for Thursday 22 May (approx 3-9 pm) in the northern highlands of Valle Central near San Isidro de Heredia (Finca La Ronda). All four courses run through dairy country nearby Braulio Carrillo National Park. Lead hares are Spouse, Roids, Sarge, Buddha, One Ball, and Chapa. Hashers select from the following trails:

- #1: "**Catarata**". Starts at 3:00 pm. 2.5 hours. Steep terrain, dense forest, slippery footing, prepare to get cold & wet.
- #2: "**Quebrada**". Starts at 3:30 pm. 2 hours. Serious hills, rolling pastures, some remnant forest, excellent views.
- #3: "**Yerbabuena**". Starts at 4:00 pm. 1.5 hours. Rolling hills, ornamental farms, typical campesino setting, chance to mix.
- #4: "**No Mas Huevos**". Starts at 4:30 pm. 1 hour. Slight upgrade, mostly open terrain, private trail with unique setting.

Costa Rica is a true wonderland of diverse climates, habitats and cultures. This event is your **ONLY** chance to experience "montane wet forest" during InterAm. Registration includes bus transport, scenic run, hot meal, cold beer, and tropical entertainment, plus the first 400 regos will receive a unique t-shirt. **Bring flashlight & extra dry clothing.**

### Run #1, Friday, May 23 University for the Peace Run

Captained by "Fancy Pants", Friday's run will be starting at 4 pm. This "**University for the Peace**" run is being run almost entirely through the University's own private property. Much of this area is covered by coffee trees and primary forest filled with white-faced monkeys and other such creatures. Careful! Monkeys can be cantankerous liking very much to pee down on hashers. This run should take about an hour and a half and is filled with steep climbs, sharp descents and primary forest. It will be possible for a couple short-cuts (for those in need of a short-cut, talk to the hares). This run offers some "most spectacular" views of Costa Rica's Central Valley, the Nicoya Peninsula and its magnificent gulf. The "On On" party, offering local music and a catered dinner, will be held at "La Marantha", a private farm just east of the University.

### Run #2, Saturday, May 24 Playa Herradura Beach Run

Captained by "Bambi", this run will be starting at 12 noon just after a 2 hour scenic bus ride down off the mountain and out to the beach. This beach run has several starting points varying the length of each run. So pay attention to which bus you get on when boarding at the hotel. The "**Ball-buster**" run starts high up in the hills, miles inland and eventually withers its way down to the



shoreline. This run will take approximately 4 hours of hashing before reaching the end. The “**Long**” run starts further down the hill and will provide thrills and views for about 1:45 to 2:30 hours of hashing. The “**Medium**” run will take about one and a half hours before reaching the cold beer and “On On” site out on the beach. Be prepared for some vigorous, hot running with lots of ups and down hills. Hats and suntan lotion are recommended, and 2 bottles of water are mandatory on these runs for everyone’s safety.

### Run #3, Sunday, May 25 The “Tico Train” Run

Captained by “Slo Dick”, Sunday’s runs start with the early morning “**Tico Train**”. **Attention all Hashers!** When the train reaches the three (3) drop-off spots, please pay close attention to the hares and signs posted in each individual train car to avoid accidentally ending up on the wrong trail! The “**Long**” Run should take over 2 and a half hours. This 100 year old “ex-Gold Miners Trail” is full of hills, sharp descents, and jungle out in the middle of nowhere. Requires energy! Next, The “**Medium**” Run also follows this old “ex-Gold Miners Trail” which is full of great views! It should take approx. 1 hour and 45 minutes. And finally, The “**Short**” Run should take about a full easy hour. Some may say the “**Short Run**” is for “poofas”, while others may say it is just what they needed! NOTE: If you are part of the walking wounded or just aren’t up for running, stay on the bloody train! It is important to start this run with a bottle or two of water. May sound like a pain in the buttski, but very good advice! Remember: “Watch out for falling rocks, as they may contain Gold!”

### Run #4, Monday, May 26 Agua Mania (Waterland)

Captained by “Hooligan”, this final “official” InterAm run starts at 12 noon, well after the GM Meeting to decide who gets the honor of holding the next InterAm. Never getting too far from the hotel, this run has lots of small ups and downs, some nice views, neighborhood people, authentic Costa Rican dogs and the final opportunity of one good last Hash run before leaving Costa Rica. This grand finale provides Hashers some good splashing, an exquisite “farewell” meal, and a few more final InterAm 2003 “down-downs”. Hashers should stick a few dollars in their dry bags to take to this event for their own enjoyment of the amusement rides at Agua Mania.

## InterAm 2003 in a Nutshell . . . .

### May 22, 2003: Okinawa Jungle Pre-lewd Hash Run

First buses leave from the Hotel Irazu at 2 pm.

Last buses leave from the Hotel Irazu at 3pm.

Run starts at 3, 3:30 & 4pm sharp.

**Bring:** Flashlight & extra dry clothing for the wet climate. No need to bring money nor valuables. Insect repellent optional.

### May 23, 2003: University for the Peace Run

First buses leave from the Hotel Irazu at 2pm.

Last bus for the run leaves the Hotel Irazu at 3pm.

Late buses will leave periodically from the Hotel Irazu for those who arrive late.

First bus returning back to the hotel leaves the University at approx. 8:30 pm

**Bring:** Extra shirt or light jacket for the evening. No need to bring money or valuables. Insect repellent & flashlight optional.

### May 24, 2003: Our "Beach" Run

First buses start leaving from the Hotel Irazu at 8am. **Important Note:** Look for "Run" signs on buses designating "Walk, Short, Medium and 'Ball-buster'"

Choose your run and your bus wisely!!!!

Last buses for the run leave the Hotel Irazu at 9:47am.

First bus returning back to the hotel leaves the beach at 8pm approximately.

**Bring:** Change of light clothing, hat, suntan lotion, insect repellent, flashlight, camelback or water bottle carrier. No need to bring money nor valuables.

### May 25, 2003: The "Nearly Forgotten Gold Miners Trail" Run

First buses leave from the Hotel Irazu at 7:45 am.

Last buses for run leave the Hotel Irazu at 8:45 am.

**Look and wait for instructions. . . . First stop: Long Run!** Do not get off the train unless you want to run this run! **Second stop: Medium Run!**

**Third stop: Short Run!** Please follow these simple instructions.

First buses returning back to the hotel leave the party at 6:00 pm.

Last bus returning back to the hotels leave the party at 7:30 pm.

**Bring:** Change of clothing, sunscreen and insect repellent. No valuables.

### "Red Dress Ball" begins at 10 pm!

Event takes place in the ballroom on the Lobby, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor of Hotel Irazu.

### May 26, 2003: Agua Mania Run! (Waterland Run!)

**GM Meeting** from 8:30 10:30 at Hotel Irazu.

First buses leave for the run from the Hotel Irazu at 10:30 am.

Last buses leave for the run from the Hotel Irazu at 11:30 am.

First bus returning back to the hotel leaves Waterland at 4 pm.

Last bus returns back to the hotel from Waterland at 5 pm.

**Bring:** Change of clothing, sunscreen. No need to bring valuables.

Some trails will be marked strictly by flour or other white "floury-like" substances. Other trails will be marked by ribbons or a combination of flour and colored ribbons.

When trails are marked with ribbon, 1 piece of ribbon is a regular trail mark, 2 pieces of ribbon represent a "False" trail, and 3 pieces of ribbon represent a check. Color of ribbons may vary from run to run but will be mentioned at the beginning of each run by the illustrious hares.

## Here is your view from the Winter Park Mountain Lodge in April.



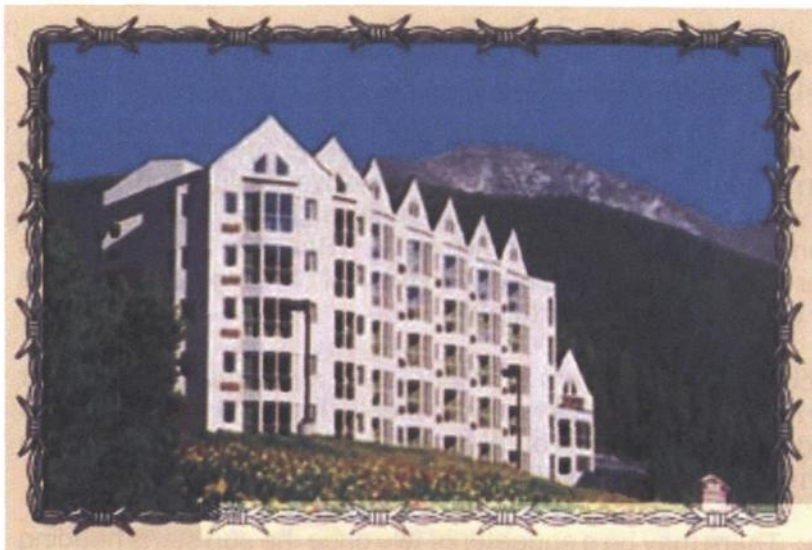

## USEFUL HASHING TIPS



While running through the beautiful mountainsides of Costa Rica, the following is a list of things you should know, or at least be curious about:

**The Heat:** Not all of our runs are going to be held in San Jose's "perfect year-round springtime temperatures". Sorry 'bout that, but this is a sacrifice we decided on to avoid exhaust fumes, the officialdom and the crowds of overly curious natives. **Drink lots and lots of Water!** This is not to save \$\$\$ on beer, but for you very own good. (Besides, bottled water is more expensive than bottled beer in Costa Rica). Do not even think of drinking from the rivers and streams! **Please don't litter with your water bottles!!!**

**The Sun:** You can bet it will be strong, so be sure to smear lots of sunscreen all over your exposed body. If you don't know how it is done, ask a fellow hasher for his/her assistance. Use SPF 15 or higher. Don't be fooled by clouds, you will burn! Care for your lips is advisable. We don't want no 'hot' lips at these runs. *Bring hats along!!!*

**Mosquitos, chiggers & ticks:** There may be a squeeter or two once the sun starts heading down. So use your bug spray if this concerns you or else you may pay the price. Chiggers never crossed the border, and ticks are a fraction of the problem in Costa Rica as they are in the states, so no worries there mate!

**Poison Ivy, Poison Oak, etc.:** All these devilish plants don't exist down here, but I did brush up against a "fire" plant one day out on the Nicoya Peninsula that nearly did me in. 10 days of hell until I was told of the garlic treatment. Place a hot, wet cloth over wounds to open up the pores. Slice up several garlic gloves and crush them between two spoons or knives. Cover the infected area heavily with the freshly squeezed garlic oil. Let dry and do not wash for hours. Bye, bye the blues. Should work on poison ivy and oak as well.

**Ants:** Think twice before petting!

**Snakes:** We feel that it is best to be aware that tropical Costa Rica is a snakey country. There are numerous poisonous snakes within its boundaries and probably some living near the trails that we will be taken. Please don't be alarmed, in 1175 hash runs SJH3 has never had a hasher bit, and in fact, I can not ever remember even seeing a live snake on a hash run in Costa Rica. With that in mind, please don't be frightened thinking you may see a snake, because there's probably more chance of you having a date with J-lo or Ricky Martin. And if by luck you do see one it will most likely just slither away quickly. Warn other hashers to stand back. In the rare case that you get bit, if you can't catch it, try to remember what it looked like. Most importantly, remain calm. Several of your hares have taken emergency courses on snakebites and Fancy Pants was a combat medic in Viet Nam with snake capturing experience. Emergency medical attention will respond quickly. It is so important to remain calm, no matter what or how small the injury.

**Crocodiles:** Unfortunately there will be no crocodiles on any of our runs, but if you see one, try climbing a tall tree and don't let go.



**Getting Lost:** Don't panic and start running off wildly. Try to remember where you saw the last mark and go back to first mark you can find. This means you are back on trail. Now look for the real trail, but don't go off wanderin'. Try shouting as well. If nothing else, you might come across some other lost souls. Key words: Don't Panic. Find the last mark!

**Other Mishaps:** If you have some other unforeseen problem on the trails, the sweeps will have radio communication and medical and psychological help is nearby. If you encounter an emergency situation, please remain in the trail until assistance arrives. The last thing to do is go wandering off. With nearly 1000 following the trails, your most likely to get help sitting by the side of the trail. Try not to forget why you are sitting there, that's pretty important.

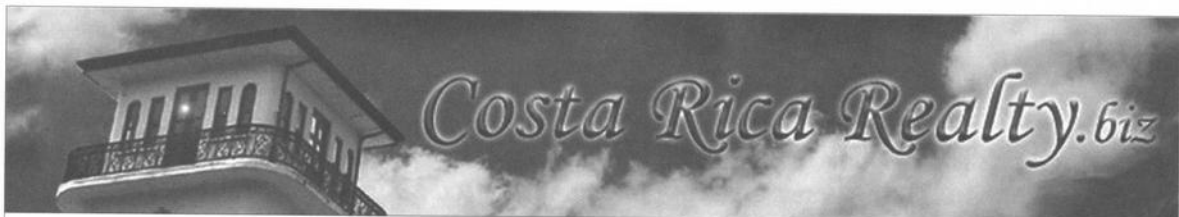

## Just the Facts . . .



Every paid hasher will receive a ton of information (mainly this booklet), bunches of beer, two meals a day (breakfast at your hotel & a catered dinner or lunch after each and every run, if you are still hungry, you are on your own), and a hash goody's bag. During registration you will be given a hash bracelet which must be worn at all times or risk penalty by law. This bracelet will get you beer, bus rides, food and lots of fun. Without it you get nothing, so try not to lose it and if it falls off, heaven forbid, find it and turn it in for a new one.

### In Case of Emergency

There should be an emergency phone number on your wrist band should you get lost and ever find a phone that works. Our suggestion is not to get lost. Remember that famous saying, "you should of done it before you thought of it!" That always helps. So try not to get lost please. We will have an ambulance available at all runs and medical help as well. Practice this word "**Auxelio**" (auck-zil-lee-oo), which means "**help**" in Spanish. We will have a "Hash Command" vehicle equipped with walky-talkies at all times which are in contact with our medical assistance.

If you end up in jail, good luck and keep your legs crossed at all times. Don't get wise with police officers and chances are you'll be let loose.

### Lost and Found

A "Lost and Found" table and time will be designated at every run shortly after dinner. Keep your ears open and try to hold onto your stuff as much ass possible.

### The Beer

All the beer will be local Costa Rican, either Imperial, Pilsen or Bavaria. At the hotel we will have Bavaria "Dark" in kegs, so look for it and drink one down down for me. For obvious reasons, we do not want hashers handling glass bottles. Plastic cups will be supplied at all times. **NOTE:** Please look for the "*Permanent Markers*" at each beer stand to write your name or some identifying mark on your plastic cup to identify them from the zillion or so other plastic cups that will be lying around at each event. This will help reduce beer wastage tremendously and assure that the beer never runs out during the entire event.

### Hash Security???

Please take care with your personal valuables at all times. Use Common Sense, which is not necessarily *Hash Sense*! Please, **no** gold, diamonds, emeralds, or pearls should be taken on a run, (if you have some, you may leave them with Fancy Pants!)

Yes ladies, the men may be out to get you too! Sounds terrible, so choose your company wisely.

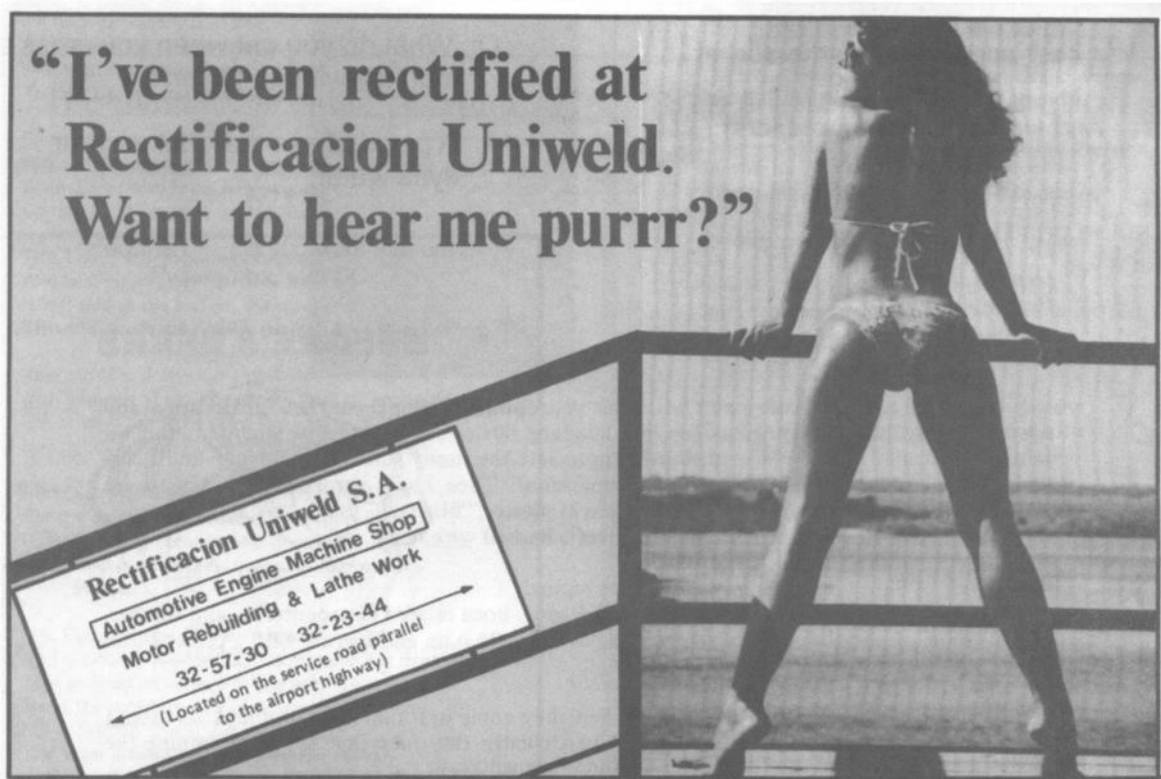

## Think you know everything about Canada, eh?



### STUDIES SHOW MOST WANKERS BELIEVE CANADA IS THE 51<sup>ST</sup> STATE

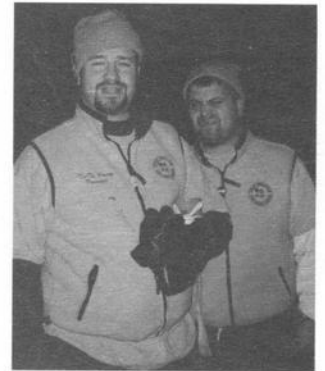
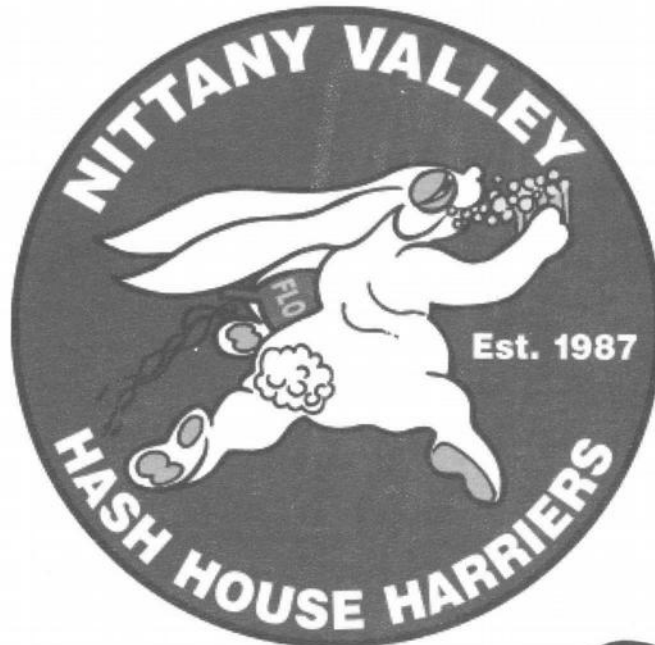
