The occurrence of this event has a unique, and yet to be fully told, origin. The Reader's Digest version begins with Inter-Americas Hash 2019 (INTERAM 2019). An exuberant and probably slightly intoxicated hoard of hashers vote to take INTERAM 2021 to South America for the first time, as the Medellin H3 in Colombia is voted in to host.

Fast forward to the spring of 2023, INTERAM 2021/22/23 is cancelled due to overwhelming circumstances (see *note above).

After the dust settles a bit, an offer is made to host a pay-as-you-go event in Guatape, Colombia for those hashers who have non-refundable travel arrangements, or just still want to go to Colombia anyway. It was dubbed OUTERAM 2023.

<u>OUTER hashing</u> was born in the aftermath of the cancelled INTERHASH that was scheduled to take place in Trinidad & Tobago.

OUTERHASH 2022 - Going Anyway

In conjunction with the announcement for OUTERAM, an alternative event (*Smutt Butts Full Moon H3 "Won't Get Screwed Again!" Labor Day Campout*) is planned for the same weekend in Maryland, and 89 hashers choose to go to this event. By all accounts, it was a fine success.

Initially, about 25 hashers signed up for OUTERAM, but in the end, due to various other concerns, and a US State Department warning, many cancelled.



We met in the center of town, and had a nice wander, a few drinks, and dinner.


Another beautiful night in Guatape.

How Was The Big Rock Of Guatape Formed?

This feature is a formation of the Cordillera Occidental Mountain Range near the Colombian Andes Mountains.

Similar to other Inselbergs like <u>Uluru</u>, these large rock formations are the result of an eroding landscape. This is often caused by flooding over a long period of time. In this case, this natural wonder is made of granite.

This is a type of igneous rock that forms when magma (molten rock) cools and solidifies deep underground. Since granite is very hard and durable, the massive rock has withstood the test of time and erosion.

The stone is estimated to be 65 million years old, according to geologists.
